

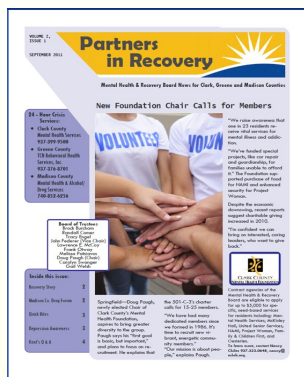

Feedback Informed Treatment (FIT)



Recently board staff participated in a workshop presented by Scott D. Miller, Ph.D. This training on "feedback-informed treatment" (FIT)-the 5th Annual "Training of Trainers" was a weeklong intensive training. FIT clinical work focuses on the consumer's valued input, the expectation of recovery, and forming partnerships with the clients.

Scott D. Miller, Ph.D. is the founder of the International Center for Clinical Excellence an international consortium of clinicians, researchers, and educators dedicated to promoting excellence in behavioral health services. Dr. Miller conducts workshops and training in the United States and abroad, helping hundreds of agencies and organizations, both public and private, to achieve superior results.

Recovery To Work



The Ohio Rehabilitation Services Commission (RSC), the Ohio Department of Alcohol and Drug Addiction Services (ODADAS), the Ohio Department of Mental Health (ODMH), and the Ohio Association of County Behavioral Health Authorities (OACBHA) and developed a project that establishes a statewide program allowing Alcohol, Drug Addiction and Mental Health (ADAMH) Boards to contract with local agencies to provide vocational rehabilitation and treatment services to eligible consumers with a mental health or substance abuse diagnosis.
