2 Dear community members,

Because of your support, Fiscal Year 2019 was a successful one for Mental Health Recovery Board of Clark, Greene & Madison Counties (MHRB). Here are some highlights:

- In response to the opioid epidemic in criminal justice and treatment settings, hosted a cross-system Sequential Intercept Mapping (SIM) event and adopted a plan in collaboration with the Criminal Justice Coordinating Center of Excellence using grant funding from the 21st Century CURES Act
- To help law enforcement learn more about mental illness, substance use, and how to improve encounters, MHRB hosted its annual Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) Training. Officer resilience, cultural awareness, and de-escalation strategies were key topics.
- Secured additional funding for Madison County's first recovery house for men
- Partnered with key Greene County stakeholders to support community members in the aftermath of the Memorial Day tornadoes. Efforts included creating an emotional support center; providing training, resources, and materials; and linking individuals to therapists and support groups.
- Renewed a 1.0 mill property levy with overwhelming support from Clark County voters across every precinct. Owners of a \$100,000 home will pay less than \$3 a month to help nearly 10,000 Clark County residents each year.

 Welcomed three new staff members: Ashley Mack, assistant director of prevention; Carolyn Wright, assistant director of treatment and support; and Shannon Haggy, receptionist Introduced several new board members, including: Howard Maynard Jr., John Young, Lori Thomas, Dr. Michael Sherr, Todd Boone, and re-appointed Scott Anger

Over the next year, MHRB will be continuing its efforts to provide more effective and meaningful solutions by using data to guide and inform our decisions. This data-driven strategy will allow us to examine and measure what success looks like for our communities and assess how well we are addressing the needs of the public. But without your help, this data is incomplete.

So I have a favor to ask of you, our community: Join us.

Share with us your experiences by calling our board office—especially if you encountered challenges finding care for yourself or a loved one. Speak up when you hear negative comments about mental health or substance use concerns, and help educate others about the facts. Substance use and mental health concerns are brain disorders and not moral failures—help us get that message across to loved ones, colleagues, neighbors and the community at large. Join us in reducing death by suicide and overdose by normalizing public conversations about mental health and substance use disorders. Asking for and



receiving help is both difficult and couragous. So when you are feeling lost or need help, reach out. We're here, and we're grateful for the opportunity to serve you.





Levy dollars

MHRB uses federal and state funding to offer better local services for mental health and substance use whenever possible. Sometimes, federal and state funding are available for short periods of time, or they have restrictions.

In those cases, MHRB can use local levy dollars to provide better care for people in Clark, Greene, and Madison counties.



We know that having safe and stable housing can help give people with mental illness or substance use disorders a better chance of getting and staying well. That's why MHRB pays for supportive housing like group homes and temporary or recovery housing.



MHRB supports more than 20 local contract care providers, who offer mental health and substance use services. By having a relationship with MHRB, these providers get funding that they wouldn't otherwise have access to.
